

Notes on IRS Revenue



84% of all US tax revenue is paid by
For-Profit employees

Do Government workers and contractors (city, county, state and federal) pay federal income taxes? Yes, but they are using our (for-profit) tax dollars to pay their salaries and their taxes. They subtract from the tax base, they do not add to it.

Do non-profit organization employees pay federal taxes? Yes, but they are using diverted tax dollars to pay their salaries and their taxes. We, the For-profit workers have to pick-up-the-tab on all those diverted tax dollars. Tax exempt organizations subtract from the tax base, they do not add to it.

The only way government and non-profit workers contribute to the tax base is through taxes paid on their personal investments.

The for-profit workers pay their own salaries and taxes; they also pay the salaries and taxes for all government and non-profit workers.

For-profit workers make up more than 84% of the federal tax base.
